

Buckeye Conference Meet

Ross is 3rd in Buckeye track meet

LORAIN — A record-setting performance by Jeff Opelt and a determined mile relay team led Fremont Ross into a surprising third place finish in the Buckeye Conference Track Meet. The Little Giants trailed the Sandusky Blue Streaks, winners for the 7th time in a row and winners of 10 of the last 11 BC meets, and Admiral King.

Ross, with a clutch performance by the mile relay team and a first and a third in the pole vault, nudged Findlay by one-half point for third with 35½ points. Findlay was disqualified in the 880-relay and that blunder cost them the third place finish.

Ross and the Trojans are now in a tight race for the Buckeye Conference All-Sports Trophy and the third place by Ross could help the Little Giants take a long stride in collecting that honor.

Jeff Opelt was the Ross star of the night. The Little Giant senior won his specialty, the pole vault, and returned as the Conference champ. Opelt had won the pole vault as a sophomore but injuries kept him from repeating last year.

Opelt and Steve Gowitzka kept the pressure on the rest of the field of vaulters virtually all night in the chilly, windy weather that at times hampered the vaulters.

Opelt and Gowitzka did not miss until the bar went to 13 feet. Opelt cleared the bar easily on his first effort but Gowitzka missed all three tries, just barely touching the bar on his last effort but enough to knock it off the standards.

With the record clearly in sight, Opelt kept clearing the bar until at the 14-2 mark, the Ross vaulter broke the old Buckeye Conference mark of 13-1½ set by Jerry Klopp of Elyria in 1968 at Sandusky. Opelt tried for 14-6 but failed three times as the cold weather started to take its toll. The 14-2 mark officially set a new Ross school record also.

The mile relay team of Terry Shearon, Jim Heidelberg, Sam Starks, and Tim Smith, covered the distance in 3:29.4, beating Findlay by nearly a second. Shearon had given the Ross team a three-yard lead on the first leg while Heidelberg opened the lead to six on the second leg.

Starks kept that margin on his portion of the race but on Smith's leg, the rest of the field pulled close on the second turn and the back stretch. But Smith never did let the field get within a couple of yards before

turning on the speed in the last turn and winning the race easily.

Heidelberg finished third in the long jump with his best effort of the season for Ross, a 20-9 effort. The long jump came on his last effort. He also was fourth in the 220.

Paul Fahrback placed second in the high jump with a Ross school record-equalling 6-2 effort. Fahrback set the Ross record previously this season.

Starks was fourth in the mile with a 4:41.6. John Williams of Marion nosed out Findlay's Brent Beams to set a new record in the distance with a 4:26.9.

Picking up other points for Ross were Mike Pendelton with a fifth in the discus; the 880-yard relay team, tied for second; Tim Smith, second in the 440 in 51.9; and Larry Liggins in the 180 lows, fifth.

Bob Sherman of Sandusky was the individual star of the meet with three firsts and one second. Stan Tillman won two events for Mansfield.
