

Baron, Garcia Gun For State Doubles Crown

Ross high school's talented tennis squad moved outdoors Tuesday in preparation for the opening match of the season on April 14 against Sandusky at Roger W. Young Park.

Bill Carver's netters have been working out in the gymnasium for the last two weeks. Eight matches have been scheduled, and Carver has agreements with Toledo DeVilbiss and Toledo Waite, but no dates have been set.

Carver has hopes that the crack doubles team of Jack Baron and Dick Garcia will bring home a state championship. That's the aim right now, declares the coach.
