WILLARD UPSET BY ROSS GIRLS

Last Half Rally Falls Short for Flashes; Heinline Stars

Fremont Ross high's girls basketball team opened its 1936 season at Ross gymnasium Friday night by defeating Willard in a close and exciting contest, 23 to 18.

Willard's girls almost upset the Fremont sextet in the final half when they chopped into the 17 to 7 lead which Coach Eleanor Tennersted's team had at the half.

Heinline, at center for the Fremont girls, paced her team to victory with 14 points, while Clopstein, forward for the Flashes, tallied nine for Willard.

Early Advantage

The score at the end of the first period was 4 to 2 for Fremont, and the Purple lassies increased this to 17 to 7 at the half. They moved only two points in the third quarter, but was still ahead, 19 to 13, when the last period started.

The Willard girls staged a rally at the opening of the final quarter, and pulled to within one point of the Purple sextet, then Heinline scored another basket for Fremont, and assured the locals their first triumph.

FREMONT GIRLS UPSET MEDINA

Heinline With 21 Points, Leads Purple to Win Friday Night

With Jean Heinline dropping 21 points through the net, Fremont Ross high school girls' basketball team defeated Medina girls at Ross gymnasium Friday night, 32 to 16.

It was the second consecutive win in as many starts for Coach Eleanor Tennerstedt's team, which last week defeated the strong Willard sextet by four points.

High Scoring

Miss Heinline, of Lindsey, rolled ten field goals and one foul through the net, to score all but 11 of her team's points. The other 11 points were credited to Miss Weinhart, forward on the purple team.

Miss Mellert, center for the Medina team, led her mates in scoring with nine of the 16 points. Miss Kovic was second with a total of six points.

Good Floorwork

Due to accurate shooting by Miss Heinline, and excellent floorwork by Miss Baker and Miss Weinhart, the Ross girls took a 11 to 4 lead at the first quarter, and increased the advantage to 18 to 7 at the half. They were in front 24 to 11 at the close of the third period.

The Ross girls will play again next Friday when they travel to Bloomville for their first out of town engagement.

Miss Heinline, who will be remembered by many as a star on the Lindsey eighth grade girls' team a few seasons back, scored 22 points in a game last year, and that mark still stands. Against Medina, she scored ten field goals and a foul for 21 points. She missed at least two shots in that game that could just as well have fallen through the meshes as on the outside.

The Ross high girls' team may not complete an undefeated season, but they have already topped a couple of A-1 teams in Willard and Medina. Their schedule did not start until two weeks ago, but they are making up for lost time now.
