Ross opens season

Five lettermen return for coach Dave Fleming's 21st Fremont Ross golf team.

One veteran, Dan Grossman, graduated off the 1994 squad. Grossman helped the Little Giants to a clean sweep in six Great Lakes League matches before the team settled for second in the GLL following the league tournament.

Rob Hammer and Eric Brough, junior Jim Straight and sophomores Mark Walter and Troy Ritchie are the lettermen. The five, Fleming said, will probably be in the lineup "most of the time."

"I think we are better this year," Fleming said. "We lost Grossman, who was an awesome player, but all the other kids have improved from last year, so we should be pretty tough."

Hammer averaged 35 or 36 strokes per nine holes during preseason practice, with Ritchie a couple shots above that and the rest "right around 40."

"We should have four or five kids shooting in the 30s most every time out," Fleming said. "That will make us pretty tough if they do that. If they keep shooting like they have this summer, this could be the best team I have ever had."

Three others may see varsity duty including freshman Jay Farrell, currently ranked seventh in Fleming's scoring system. His sixth man for today's Maumee Tournament was Chad Donovan, a senior. Mack Cole, another freshman, could also see varsity action.

Fleming indicated this could be his final season at Ross.

"I am looking for a GLL title, for sure, but Napoleon will be tough and Findlay always is," he said. "Winning the GLL is our main goal."

Findlay is competing in the GLL for the first time. The Little Giants placed third in the nine-team Swanton Invitational. Genoa won with a score of 325, and Wauseon was second at 350.

Rob Hammer shot an 81 as Ross finished at 352.



St. Joe manages win at Ross Invitational

Charlie Baker's feelings were tempered.

The Fremont St. Joseph Central Catholic High School golf coach was happy his team won its fourth consecutive Fremont Ross Invitational championship Saturday at the Fremont Country Club, but he was unhappy with the way his team won it.

"To tell you the truth," Baker said, "today we were happy just to get out of Dodge. This was one of our poorest performances of the year. It was disappointing because the five boys I played are all members of the club...they did not play up to potential."

Kevin Kayden, the FCC club championship runner-up, led St. Joe with a 79. Ben Sorenson added an 84, the same as Kevin Cooney, and Aaron Zimmerman shot 86.

"The conditions were beautiful...there was no excuse," Baker said. "But we are pleased, fortunate and happy (to win)."

The Crimson Streaks shot 333 in the nine-team tournament, beating runner-up Bellevue by seven strokes and Ross by eight on a sunny day with little wind.

Genoa, which was voted the sportsmanship trophy by the coaches and players, was fourth with 347. Fifth was Toledo St. Francis with 356.

Willard led by tournament medalist Jason Kessler's 77, was sixth with 360.

Rounding out the field were

Port Clinton with 361, Swanton at 369 and Clyde with 376.

Fifth-man Eric Brough was low for Ross with an 82. Rob Hammer was next with 84.

Aaron Pagnard's 81 led Bellevue. Pagnard was out in 43 but carded a 38 on the inward nine. Clyde was paced by Brad Kinnear's 82 but Rob Jennings was the next lowest Flier with a 95.

Brough's round included a quadruple bogey on the 358-yard par-four fourth hole, but he still carded a 40 on the front nine. On the back nine, Ross coach Dave Fleming said Brough had a pair of triple bogeys while finishing with a 42.

"We had too many triple bogeys," Ross coach Dave Fleming said. "When they get in trouble, they go 'space' on me...they can't seem to get it out of there."

Fleming said he had a feeling how his team would do after it placed second in the Toledo Whitmer Invitational Friday with a 325, a dozen strokes behind Perrysburg.

"We played well yesterday so I knew we would not do well today," Fleming said. "I have not had anyone, except for Rob, play well two days in a row."

"If we had played today like we did yesterday, we would have shot 315-320. The wind (Friday) was awful up there."

Hammer shot a 79 in the Whitmer tourney.
