Hurler Zoldak Big Surprise

CLEVELAND, April 15—P—Manager Lou Boudreau, home with his Cleveland Indians for their last two exhibition games, today declared this spring's training trip, "one of the best I've conducted."

Arriving 11 hours early because cold weather cancelled a game yesterday at Indianapolis, Boudreau said southpaw Sam Zoldak was one of the pleasant surprises of training and barnstorming season.

"Zoldak really looked like a different pitcher," Boudreau said. "He now has control and his fast ball has more zip, I'm hoping that his knee injury won't keep him idle long as we'll need Sam to get off to a fast start."

Sam Hit On Knee

Zoldak was hit below his right knee by a batted ball in Kansas City Thursday and is still nursing a bad bruise.

After games today and tomorrow against the New York Giants, the Indians will start the American League season Tuesday against Detroit.

So far this spring they have won 21 and lost 14 and hold a 9-7 series edge over the Giants.

Boudreau hopes to get a fast league start on the pitching of Bob Lemon, Bob Feller, Early Wynn and Zoldak. His other two first line pitchers, Mike Garcia and Al Benítez, have missed a good part of the training. Garcia, who has pitched only two innings since March 23, was called home by the death

ROSS HIGH TRACK SQUAD MEETS B. G.; JUNIORS COP CLASS MEET

Ross high school's track squad turned to its first skirmish of the season this afternoon at Bowling Green after tuning up with an inter-class meet yesterday. The class meet was originally scheduled for Wednesday but was postponed by rain.

The Juniors won the meet, scoring 56 1/2 points to 48 for the Seniors. The Freshmen were third, getting 8 1/2 points. The Sophomores tallied 8. The victors won six of the 11 events, with the Seniors taking four and the Sophomores one, the discus throw. Bob Biggs, 200-pounder, won the discus event with a throw of 119 feet.

Lee Wins 100

Tom Lee caused some eyebrow lifting when he won the 100-yard dash. The usually-speedy Charlie Glover wound up in third place as Lee battled Marlin Farver for the finish line. It was a close finish. Lee was clocked in 10.6 seconds.

Farver placed fourth behind two eighth graders and Senior Earl Looman, the winner, in the 220-yard dash. The husky Looman finished ahead of Charles Black, who was second, and Ronnie Whitcomb, third. Both Black and Whitcomb are in the eighth grade but performed for the Freshmen.

Ross high school's track squad was handed a 69-49 setback by the Bowling Green thinclads in the opening meet of the season for the local lads Friday at Bowling Green.

The Giants were able to nail only six first in the 14 events, with Charlie Glover finishing ahead in two of them. Glover was also second in one event, making him the meet's high scorer with 13 points.

Ted Aldrich and Dave Witte of the Bobcats likewise were two-time winners. Aldrich took the mile run and the 880, while Witte captured the discuss and shot put events.

Watches Different .

Glover scored in the 100-yard dash in the unimpressive time of 11.2, although the Fremont clock showed the time to be 10.9. The B. G. watch prevails in the record book, however. Glover was trailed by Tom Lee, who beat him in the class meet Thursday.

COLUMBUS, O., April 27.—*AP*—Fritz Howell, Ohio sports editor of the Associated Press, last night

The Giants won all of the five field events after Sandusky swept six of the nine races in the track division.

Glover, versatile junior athlete, won the 100-yard dash and the broad jump, tied with Dick Sherman for first place in the high jump and was second in the 220-yard dash. He tallied 17 of Ross high's 60 points.

Willey Wins Low Hurdles

Dick Willey won the 120-yard high hurdles, and the half-mile relay team of Marlin Farver, John Anspach, Tom Lee and Earl Looman came through for the Giants in the track events. In the weight throwing department, John Allen won the shot put with a 43-foot heave and Dan Miller captured the discus throw with a mark of 121 feet, seven and one-half inches.

Billy Smith, diminutive senior, pole vaulted nine feet, nine inches to edge Billy Titsworth, his Ross teammate, and the veteran Sherman and Glover each high jumped five feet, two and one-half inches.

Six schools will compete in the Ross Invitational tomorrow, Sandusky, Norwalk, Bellevue, Fostoria, Marion and Ross.

6 Teams Entered In Invitational Track Meet Here Tomorrow

Ross high school, its hopes highly encouraged by Wednesday night's thrilling victory over Sandusky, awaits Saturday's Invitational track meet to see if the performance was a fluke.

Sandusky is the Invitational's defending champion. The Giants triumph over the Blue Streaks here was unexpected. Charlie Glover was the meet's high scorer with 17 points.

Competing will be Ross, Sandusky, Marion, Norwalk, Fostoria and Bellevue. Field events start at 1:30, running events at 2:15.

Marion Takes Invitational Meet; Sandusky 2nd, Ross 3rd; Giants Win Shot Put, Discus

A well-balanced and fine-appearing bunch of athletes from Marion Harding high school broke Sandusky's hold on the Ross Invitational track and field meet here Saturday afternoon.

Performing in weather that would have been considered cold in football season, the Presidents ran up 61 points to 47½ for Sandusky. Ross, which defeated Sandusky in a duel meet Wednesday, placed third with 36½. Fostoria collected 32½, Bellevue 31½ and Norwalk 14½.

All entrants except Norwalk managed to get a first, with Marion copping the low hurdles, the 880-yard run and the pole vault. In the latter event, Marion's Barrett and Reeves tied at 10 feet, 3 inches.

Bertch Wins 2 Races

Dale Bertch of Sandusky was the only two-time winner, breezing home easily in the 100-yard and the 220-yard dashes. Marion's Paul Ludwig, a well-built athlete, won the high hurdles by 12 feet over Perry of Fostoria and Ludwig was second to Bellevue's Jim Hickman in the low hurdles. Ludwig

shot 43 feet, 1½ inches. Biggs whirled the discus 129 feet, 9¾ inches.

The meet was in doubt until the pole vault results came in. Both Barrett and Reeves easily cleared the winning height, 10 feet, 3 inches, but because of the extreme cold decided not to continue their contest after Ross high's Billy Smith who finished third barely failed to clear the bar. The bar wavered for an instant, then toppled to the earth.

Bellevue again showed its class in the mile relay, an event it took last year. Norwalk's best effort was third place.
