Mezinger simply hopes his tenure is on par with that of Grover Dowell, the coach he replaces. Mezinger was one of Dowell's assistants since the early 1990s.

Mezinger, 37, is a 1985 graduate of Ross. He was a varsity wrestler for three years and qualified for state as a senior.

"I wanted the job because I'm very interested in seeing the wrestling program at Ross excel," Mezinger said. "It's got a ton of tradition and I want to continue that and hopefully get a second state champ — we've been waiting a long time. We've always had state qualifiers, and I want to continue that tradition of having kids down in Columbus year after year."

Jim Mooney (1963) remains the Little Giants' only state champion.

Mezinger's stamp on Fremont wrestling is already prominent after he started a biddy program with the YMCA three years ago and coached middle school last year.

He could see many of those youngsters, including his freshman son Devon, on his mats in the coming years.

"I don't plan on being here a few years and moving on," Mezinger said. "I plan on being here quite a while."

And Mezinger has already formed a symbiotic relationship with new Ross football coach Derek Kidwell.

"I'm excited about the way the program is going," Mezinger said. "Last year we only had a couple senior wrestlers. Now, a ton of my wrestlers are in the weight room for (Kidwell) this year. We've been cross recruiting. Hopefully we can share athletes, and it will help both sports."

Runner-up Ross has 3 champs

Mike Mezinger found himself in a new situation.

As did his Fremont Ross wrestling team.

Mezinger, participating in his first Mal Mackey Memorial Invitational as head coach, watched the Little Giants fail to capture the team title at their tournament for the first time since 1993.

And he had no problem with the runner-up finish


Friday.

"I can't complain," Mezinger said. "We had a lot of wrestlers step it up a notch today. We knew we had to, if we wanted to place second."

Ross tied Sylvania Northview with 158 points, while Bowling Green pulled away with 214.5.

Derek Flores (103), Sam Krueger (130) and Jorge

Ross coach happy with rare runner-up finish

Perez (215) each garnered individual titles as the Little Giants placed wrestlers in 10 of the 13 weight classes they entered.

Zach Brunner (119), Grant Hilty (135) and Chris Bias (145) each claimed runner-up honors for the Little Giants.

Travis Rodriguez (112), Brad Biehler (160) and Robert Zucker (275) finished third, while Josh Howey (152) took fourth.

"It's a big confidence booster for my young guys who came in and placed or won a couple matches," Mezinger said.


Flores got the ball rolling in the first match of the final session. The freshman wasted little time in taking down Northwood's Brian Meinhart before pinning him at the 1:25 mark of the first period.

"I saw his first match, and he really didn't have any technique," said Flores, who began the sport a year ago. "He just tried to throw his opponent. I looked out for it and stayed in a good stance."

Added Mezinger: "Flores goes right after the guys and catches some of them."

Krueger used an extra incentive in dismantling the 130-pound field. Battling a knee injury, the senior had a pair of first-period pins before beating Bowling Green's Alex Moore on a second-period technical fall in the final.

"I didn't want to take anything into the third period," said Krueger,

who also won the Mal Mackey last year. "My plan was to not do anything stupid. My knee was hurting, and I wanted to come out and get things done. I didn't want to risk a chance of getting hurt."

Perez, who was a match away from qualifying for state last year, dominated Bowling Green's Adam McGriffen in the neutral position en route to an 11-5 decision. Perez, the top seed in the tournament, pinned Perrysburg's Bob Kurek in 26 seconds to reach the finals.

Inarguably, the most exciting final-round match for the Little Giants came in the last bout. Needing a victory to catch Northview for second place, heavyweight Robert Zucker came from behind to knock off Bowling Green's Joe Miller 10-8 in overtime in the consolation final.

An injury prevented Zucker from

wrestling last year as well as playing football in the fall. Mezinger certainly appreciates his big man.

"He came up big," Mezinger said. "He came back and fought through everything and got that takedown in overtime."

Just like Zucker, Hilty is back on the mats after a long layoff. After a successful biddy wrestling career, he quit the sport in the seventh grade to play basketball.

Hilty is happy to have taken up the sport once more, but he regrets the hiatus.

"Part of me says that I would have done it different," Hilty said. "All the big names now, I wrestled and beat on them (in biddy). Every match I'm remembering things."

"It's all coming back," he continued, "but it's going to be a long way to get there."



Clyde wrestlers enjoyed a sweet treat after a dominant tri-meet sweep of Sandusky and host Fremont Ross Wednesday.

Dawn Aona made cookies to mark her son's 100th career victory.

It was a special award for Brent's accomplishment.

Dawn couldn't make cookies every time a Clyde wrestler topped the milestone. Her oven constantly would be running — and so would the Fliers. With all of the treats they would eat, they would have to do extra workouts just to make

weight.

Aona is the second Clyde standout to top 100 wins this season, joining fellow junior Robbie Michaels. Unbelievably,

three more teammates — juniors Matt Guhn and Eric Schwartz and senior Adam Thurn — likely will join the usually ultra-exclusive club this campaign.

These powerhouse Fliers — ranked No. 4 in the state's Division II poll — are making the extraordinary ordinary.

"These kids are getting in (the varsity lineup) early and doing their job," he continued. "They have stepped up and have wrestled very well. It's a great situation."

Aona notched a technical fall in a 135-pound match to notch his 100th victory and cap the Fliers' 65-12 win over Ross.

He won by decision in Clyde's 62-10 victory over Sandusky, which topped Ross 45-23.

"Brent is a great kid," Carroll said. "We would love to have 14 of him on the team. He is one of those dedicated kids who wrestles all year long — through the summer and during open mats.

"He's not a very vocal leader, but he is truly the silent leader of the team," Carroll continued. "He does absolutely everything."

Eleven Fliers followed Aona's double-win ways Wednesday.





Ross heavyweight makes quick work of foes in tri-meet split


PORT CLINTON — It's a good thing Robert Zucker doesn't get paid by the hour.

The Fremont Ross heavyweight wouldn't have earned a dime for his time in Wednesday's tri-meet with Norwalk and host Port Clinton.

Zucker dominated during a pair of matches that added up to only 47 seconds of work.

"That's the best and easiest way to get it over with — don't drag it out,"

The pinfall helped the Little Giants earn a split at the tri-meet with a 59-24 win over the Redskins.

"He's so big. He just doesn't wrestle like he's that big," Ross coach Mike Mezinger said of Zucker. "That's what we want him to do — use his height, use his weight. He's starting to do that now."

Zucker was one of five Little Giants to pick up a pair of wins Wednesday.

Jorge Perez (189 pounds), Zach Brunner (119) and Jaime Mendoza (112) each recorded two pins during the tri-meet.

Derek Flores also notched two wins, scoring a pinfall against Norwalk and tallying a forfeit victory against Port Clinton.

He was just warming up.

Against Port Clinton's Ben Brady, Zucker was even more impressive. He needed a scant nine seconds to pick up his second

Flores combined with Perez, Zucker, Mendoza and Brunner for an impressive Ross run of pins in the first dual.

Trailing Norwalk 26-6, Perez pinned Jeremy Striker in 1:07 to start a roll of five straight pinfalls for the Little Giants.

Brunner's victory in 1:54 over Pat Gray was the last of the streak and put Ross ahead 36-26.

"(Norwalk) was beating us pretty good, and then Jorge started us off," Mezinger said. "My lighter weights, and 215 on up, have been our strength."
