Ross boys' 4x100 wins

ley and Sweeney was eighth in 4:24.51.

The boys sent seven individuals and a relay team to the finals. The 4x100 team of Kenny Morrisette, Robert Atkins, Kelly Lytle and Demetrius Simms finished first.

Morrisette was fourth in the 200 in 23.66. Atkins was fifth in the 100 in 11.61, Jordan Mackey was third in the 300 dash and eighth in the 300 hurdles,

Allen Lutes was third in the 110 hurdles in 15.78, Matt Kotch was sixth in first heat of the 800 and Ryan Daugherty was seventh in the event's second heat.

One of the few disappointments for Ross came in the 100 when Morrisette, a favorite to win the event, was disqualified for a false start.

"We were disappointed with that but Kenny's main goal is to win in the 4x100 relay," Elder said.

The boys 4x400 relay team of Daugherty, Kotch, Brett Spicer, and Jon Framstad placed eighth in 8:54 and did not advance.

"The overall time was a little slow," Esposito said. "But two of them (Kotch and Daugherty) still had to run the individual 800, so they were holding back for that."

Ross girls lead district meet

Competition finishes Friday in Fostoria

FOSTORIA — So far so good for the Fremont Ross track and field teams competing at the Division I district track meet.

The Little Giants' girls team is in first place and the boys team is in a three-way tie for third after the first day at Fostoria Memorial Stadium.

The two-day meet will conclude Friday with finals in 23 events. The top four finishers in

each competition move on.

"I think our first day went well," Ross coach John Elder said. "It's going pretty much as we expected. We are off to a good start."

Four events were decided Wednesday. Ross' boys long jumpers Rashad Brown and Reggie Jones, girls' discus thrower Michelle Salas and the girls 400 relay team all finished in the top four to advance to the regional meet next week at Margaretta High School.

The girls 4x800 relay team may not have had its best race but it was good enough. Jamie Toeppe, Alison Kelly, Molly Gocke and Lindsay Frontz finished in 10:04 good for first place.

"I'm real pleased," said Ross distance coach Cathy Esposito. "The time was a little slow but the race was slow. The competition wasn't as good as it will be next week (at the regional meet). This team is capable of running a 9.45."

The girls finished ahead of Celina (10:06), Findlay (10:08) and Wapakoneta (10:09).

"We ran as well as we had to," said senior Alison Kelly.

Said Lindsay Frontz: "We will perform better when we need to."

Salas easily won the discus with a throw of 136 feet, 6 inches. Bowling Green's Sheila Minske was a distant second at 127-3.

Cathy Hoile of BG and Columbian's Kati Fraley also advanced.

"Michelle has been on a roll," Elder said. "We expected her to win."

Brown was second in the boys high jump with a leap of 6-6 and Jones was third at 6-5. Lima's Shaun Guice was first at 6-8. Lexington's Greg Domyan also advanced with a 6-2.

"We're real excited about the high jump," Elder said. "Rashad historically has not jumped well in Fostoria. We're real pleased with both boys."

For the girls, five more individuals and two more relays advanced to the finals.
