WADE CAMPBELL STATE CHAMPION

Fremont Young Man Wins Cross Country Run of Ohio State

Wade (Soupy) Campbell, of Fremont Ross high school, Saturday became the champion cross country runner of Ohio when he finished first in the annual state meet held at Ohio State University, Columbus, according to Associated Press dispatches.

Campbell, at the district meet held over the Ottawa Hills course at Toledo, also finished first. His time for the difficult course at Columbus Saturday was 10.24 minutes.

Despite Campbell's brilliant performance, Toledo Scott high school won the team honors at the district gathering, finishing with the lowest score recorded against it. Salem high school took second place.

Nine Fremont Ross harriers were entered in the meet by Track Coach Harold Althoff. The team is to be guests of the Ohio State-Illinois football game Saturday afternoon.

Harold Althoff, Ross high track coach, who had charge of the fine Little Giant cross country team this fall, handed me a clip sheet from a state publication showing results of various district cross country meets.

The main point of interest, of course, was the list of victors in the state meet at Columbus which showed Wade Campbell of the Purple harrier squad, is recognized as state champion. "Soupy" traveled the Ohio State course in 10:24, leading 80 other boys to the tape.

Fremont was given fifth place in team standing, with 142 points. Toledo Scott won the meet, with only 41 points (low points mean winners in cross country). Salem was second with 85 points; Cleveland Lincoln, third, 103; Cleveland Shaw, fourth, 121; and then Fremont. Other teams in the first ten finished in this order: Dayton Roosevelt, Cincinnati Hughes, Akron East, Newark and Barberton.
