



TO STATE—Ron Brown, Ross high senior, finished fourth in the individual running of the District cross country meet at Sandusky to qualify for Saturday's State cross country individual race at Columbus.

Brown Seventh In Ohio Cross Country Test

Ron Brown, Ross high senior, competed Saturday in the annual Ohio high school cross country meet staged on Ohio State's golf course, ran the event in seven-tenths of a second over 10 minutes, the best time he has ever scored. But the speed was good enough for only seventh place in the meet.

Brown competed as an individual, the Ross team not qualifying for the state event.

The runner was accompanied to Columbus by Coach John Ihnat, who said the lad did a brilliant job over the Ohio State course.

Akron Buchtel won the cross country team title with 53 points, called a remarkable score by Ihnat, while Cleveland Brush was second with 114. Other team scores were Worthington 118, Dayton Jefferson 138, Dayton Roosevelt 150, Cleveland Marshall 188. Teams from northern Ohio included Marion 239, Ashland 244 and Toledo Woodward 269.

Best individual was Warren Head of Dayton Roosevelt with 9:51.3.
