Tim Thomas finished third in a time of 12 minutes over the two-mile Tremain Park course in Toledo this week as Fremont Ross cross - country team dropped its first outing, 22-35, to Toledo Woodward.

Woodward's Tom Hartack had the best time of 11:27, followed by team mate Dennis Palmer at 11:54. Finishing behind Thomas in third were Roland Wood, Woodward, 12:07; Bob Grayson, Ross, 12:08; and Jeff Waggoner, Ross, 12:12.

Also competing for Ross were Ken Hughes, Rex Damschroder, Tom Hilt, Dan Scherf, Dan Lease and Neal Allen.

Woodward is coached by Fremont's Jim Bounds.
