# Teams set for Norm Bray Invitational

Fremont Ross cross country coach Cathy Esposito says Norm Bray was the reason she entered coaching and teaching, a "majorly inspirational" force in her life.

Most prominently, Esposito thinks the deceased Bray was with her Little Giants in spirit as they competed in the state meet.

"I think about him all the time, up there watching, sitting there snickering," said Esposito, whose team competes in the annual Norm Bray Invitational Saturday morning at Walsh Park. "When we went to state, I think, he was really geeked. It was real emotional for me."

Bray was the long-time Ross

track and cross country coach, who, according to Ross boys coach John Elder, founded the girls program in the early 1980s, and influenced athletes like Rob Lytle.

After years of hosting a meet in conjunction with St. Joseph Central Catholic, a meet in which only teams with red and purple colors were invited, the schools decided to name the meet after Bray.

For Elder, there could be no more worthy recipient of the meet's name.

"He was a pretty special guy. I ran for him, Cathy did, so it's a neat way to remember someone," Elder said. "He's the last of a dying breed. He coached for 35 years, and you don't see that too often anymore. He literally did it until the day he died."

Bray's legacy may be a glowing one, but runners in Saturday's meet won't likely be singing the old coach's praises after completing the difficult course at Walsh Park.

"The course is tough because it goes around whole park twice, with the monster hill, the butt-buster," Esposito said.

"We never have any record-breaking times."

Course difficulty was one rea-

son coach Don Windom of Lakota chose to bring his team to the 1998 Norm Bray after competing in Columbus Grove the past several years.

"We wanted a chance to run against some different teams," Windom said.

"Our (Suburban Lakes) league meet is at Walsh Park, so this is a chance to run on the course before the league meet."

Top teams from Toledo Whitmer, Bowling Green and Maumee make the meet even more competitive, especially for Ross, which has not yet opened its season.

St. Joe, which has had mixed results in its early meets, looks for consistency.

# Young St. Joe streaks to Norm Bray title

## Ross girls take second in Division I, boys fifth

If any Division II or III teams have aspirations of winning the Norm Bray Invitational any time soon, they had better start working.

St. Joseph Central Catholic won the meet for the second year in a row Saturday at Walsh Park — and the Crimson Streaks' top seven runners will be back next year.

"I'm extremely pleased," said St. Joe coach Gary Logsdon. "They are a good young group. We have no seniors in our top seven (runners)."

The Streaks finished with 45 points, well ahead of second-place Hopewell-Loudon's 81. Margaretta finished third with 103 and Lakota was ninth with 168.

The Raiders won the boys Division II-III with 67 points. Tiffin Calvert was second with 78, St. Joe was sixth with 158, Genoa was seventh with 171 and Old Fort was

eighth with 175.

Fremont Ross placed second in the girls Division I race with 52 points, 12 behind champion Bowling Green. Clyde was fifth with 142.

Maumee easily won the boys Division I race with 28 points. BG was second with 83, Ross was fifth with 110 and Clyde was sixth with 116.

The Crimson Streaks had five finishers in the top 15, led by Keri Oxley, who finished in 21 minutes, 32 seconds.

Kerri Zimmerman was seventh in 22:20, Joni Wilhelm was ninth in 22:27, Tracie Snyder was 12th in 22:50 and Trisha Snyder was 14th in 23:03.

"We are very honored to win this and extremely excited about this season," Oxley said.

Said Trisha Snyder: "We got into a good pack and that really helped us."





## Esposito happy with Little Giants' performance

Keri Peiffer was 24th in 23:45.9 and Jill Wilhelm was 53rd in 27:48 for St. Joe.

Kara Simpson of Toledo Christian won the race in 20:57.

Jessie Bartz of Maumee won the Div. I race in 20:31.

"I had a good start and that helped," she said. "I wanted to get in under 20 (minutes)."

The Little Giants' girls team was led by Molly Gocke, who placed third and Abby Cominsky, who was fourth.

"I felt I did pretty well for the first meet," said Gocke, who finished in 21:30. "It's a tough course. I wanted to finish somewhere in the top 10."

Said Cominsky, who finished in 21:42: "I felt it went great, I wanted to finish in the top five. I had a good first mile and I kept a good pace."

Jenny Gabel was 14th in 22:53, Lani DeLeon was 15th in 22:59, Lindsay Frontz was 16th in 23:01, Monica McElfresh was 19th in 23:11 and Jeanette Frontz was 20th in 23:13.

"I'm happy with the overall

performance," said Ross coach Cathy Esposito. "But we still have a lot of work to do."

Old Fort's Jeremy Riehm edged St. Joe's Mike Chapman to win the boys Div. II and III race. Riehm crossed the finish line in 16:49, four seconds ahead of Chapman.

Lakota's Jeremy Miller was fifth in 17:53, teammate Eric Swaisgood was sixth in 17:33 and Will Windom was ninth in 18:20.

"Our guys had a real good run," said Stockaders coach Don Windom. "We had no idea how we would finish here. I knew

there were a lot of good teams."

Bowling Green's Nolan Fahrer won the boys race with a time of 16:43. Maumee's Brian McNutt was second in 16:52.4, one-tenth of a second ahead of teammate Nick Wineland.

Clyde's Josh Cook was fourth in 17:43. Ross's highest placer was Ryan Werling. He finished in 18:10, eight seconds ahead of teammate Jeremy Framstad.

"We're young but we're getting better," said Ross boys coach John Elder. "We'll use this as a learning experience."
