

Little Giants Boys Tennis Opens Season 2-0 in Dominant Fashion

The Fremont Ross boys tennis team is off to a blazing start this spring, opening the season with back-to-back shutout victories to move to 2-0 on the young campaign.

The Little Giants kicked things off with a commanding 5-0 win over Tiffin Calvert, showcasing depth and dominance across the board. At first singles, Charlie Kramer was nearly flawless, cruising to a 6-0, 6-0 victory. Jackson Swinehart followed suit at second singles with an impressive 6-0, 6-1 win, while Chase Culbertson secured the third singles point via forfeit.

Doubles play continued the trend of dominance. The first doubles team of Brandon Fry and Logan Wensinger controlled their match from start to finish, winning 6-0, 6-1. Carson Lewis and Casen Schwochow capped off the sweep in second doubles with a perfect 6-0, 6-0 performance.

Head Coach Lisa Wolfe was thrilled with her team's opening performance, praising the group for showing up ready to compete and execute at a high level right out of the gate.

The momentum carried into match two as the Little Giants hit the road and once again "pitched a shutout," defeating Whitmer 5-0. Coach Wolfe highlighted the continued excellence of her singles lineup, particularly Charlie Kramer and Jackson Swinehart, who have been in complete control of their courts early this season.

"The team overall is doing a great job," Wolfe noted. "The wind was in our favor at Whitmer—we know how to play in those conditions."

On April 6th, Fremont Ross dropped a close 3-2 decision to Tiffin Columbian. Both doubles teams delivered dominant performances, as #1 doubles Logan Wensinger and Brandon Fry won 6-1, 6-1, and #2 doubles Carson Lewis and Casen Schwochow cruised 6-0, 6-2. "We needed one of the singles to win, making the third point," said Head Coach Lisa Wolfe. "Tiffin has strong singles, and today they were better than us. We have been working hard and will come back strong."

The team responded in a big way on April 8th with a 3-2 win over a tough Sylvania Northview squad. #1 singles Charlie Kramer battled through a first-set tiebreaker 7-6 (7-5) before taking control in the second set, 6-1. Kramer has looked tough to start the season. Both doubles teams remained perfect, with Wensinger/Fry winning 7-5, 6-3 and Lewis/Schwochow taking care of business 6-3, 6-4. It was a complete team effort where everything fell into place.

The Little Giants stayed hot on April 9th, defeating Springfield 3-2. #2 singles Jackson Swinehart sealed the victory in a hard-fought three-set match, 6-4, 4-6, 6-2. Once again, the doubles teams continued their unbeaten streak, proving to be a consistent strength for Fremont Ross.

Coach Wolfe couldn't be more proud of her team. "They embody what it means to be a true Little Giant. We win gracefully and always show good sportsmanship on and off the court," she said. That reputation continues to grow, as even opposing coaches, parents, and fans from Springfield praised both the facility and the class displayed by the team.

With determination, teamwork, and a commitment to doing things the right way, the Little Giants are setting the tone early this season. They will look to keep their strong play going as they host Perrysburg this Monday.

Ross first squared off against Perrysburg, falling 4-1 in a hard-fought contest. Now sitting at 5-3 overall and 4-2 in NLL play, the Little Giants continue to show growth, toughness, and a willingness to compete against some of the best teams in the area.

Third Time's the Charm: Fremont Ross Wins Little Giants Doubles Invite

After two previous attempts were washed out by bad weather, the Fremont Ross tennis team finally got the chance to host its Little Giants Doubles Invite—and made the most of the opportunity by capturing the team title on their home courts.

After two earlier dates were canceled due to inclement weather, Fremont Ross welcomed teams for the long-awaited tournament and finished on top of the standings with 113 points, edging Tiffin Columbian High School, which finished second with 104 points. Oak Harbor High School placed third with 66 points, followed by Sandusky High School with 61 points.

Originally scheduled as an eight-team tournament, weather cancellations and a date change reduced the field to four teams because of scheduling conflicts and availability issues. Rather than cancel again, coaches adjusted the format and created a round-robin style tournament that allowed all teams to compete at the same time across the facility's eight courts.

Each match was played as a 10-game set, with every individual game won counting toward the overall team score—whether the match was won or lost. The unique format created a competitive but relaxed atmosphere that made for an enjoyable day of tennis.

Fremont Ross found success throughout every doubles flight.

At first doubles, Charlie Kramer and Carson Lewis finished as runners-up with 26 points, narrowly trailing Tiffin Columbian's first doubles team, which finished with 28 points.

At second doubles, Jack Swinehart and Brandon Fry captured first place in their bracket with 27 points.

The Little Giants were dominant at third doubles, where Logan Wensinger and Casen Schwochow earned a perfect 30 points by winning all three of their matches.

Fremont Ross matched that performance at fourth doubles, where Chase Culbertson and Maden DeWalt also posted a perfect 30 points while sweeping all three matches.

Beyond the championship result, the event was a rewarding one simply because it finally happened after weeks of weather frustration.

Despite the scheduling challenges, the tournament turned into a fun and competitive event featuring evenly matched teams and outstanding sportsmanship from players and coaches alike.

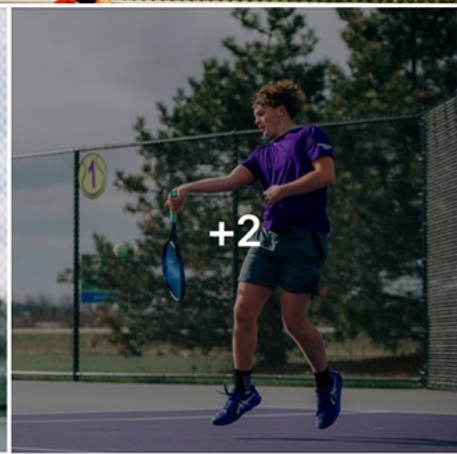
