SWIMMERS TO B-G SATURDAY

Little Giants Heavily Favored To Repeat In District Meet

The Little Giants swimmers will place their six-year reign in the northwest district on the block Saturday night over in the Bowling Green university pool, but it appears to be in little jeopardy.

The charges of Coach Bim Stults first won the district crown in 1936 and each succeeding year has seen them repeat their performance. At present they hold every district record save two, the 50 and 100 yard free style events which are held by Wenslau of Toledo Scott, no longer in school.

Just what competition the district will offer the Little Giants this year is still uncertain, but it doesn't appear as though it will be much. Coach Stults was still uninformed as to how many teams will compete, but it looks like Sandusky, Toledo DeVilbiss and Scott and Bellevue, in addition to Fremont, with possible entries in one or more events from Findlay, Bowling Green, Lima, and Toledo Waite.

The Fremonters, who have won six dual meets this year and are undefeated in high school competition for the past two years, won the district in 1941 by tallying 72 points with Sandusky's 34 points making them the runner-up. The first three finishers in each event will qualify for the state meet and Fremont should score heavily.

Preliminaries will start at 7:30 p. m. with the diving going on at 8 p. m. and the meet taking up from there.

Ross Mermen Score 71 Points To Easily Win District Meet

Entire Squad Of 13 Swimmers Qualifies For State Meet Saturday; Ken Reed Equals Record In Back Stroke; Sandusky Second

Scoring 71 points, taking six firsts and qualifying the entire squad of 13 men for the state meet in Columbus Saturday, the Little Giant swimmers dominated the Northwest District swimming meet in Bowling Green the past Saturday for the sixth consecutive year.

The Rossmen fell one point shy of their meet record of 72 points last year, but again were far ahead of their closest rivals, Sandusky, which tallied 35 points.

Only five schools entered teams and the two leaders were trailed by Toledo DeVilbiss, 20 points; Toledo Scott, 11, and Toledo Waite, eight.

Equals Record

Outstanding performance was that of Kenny Reed, who equaled the record held by Clarence Kuntz in the 100 yard back stroke, being clocked in 1:04.8. Another new record also went to Fremont when Slicker Hess won the 200-yard free style, first time this race has been on the card. In the past it was 220 yards.

The Fremont team won the 100 yard breast stroke, the 200 yard free style, the 100 yard back stroke, the 100 yard free style, the diving and the 150-yard medley relay and were just touched out by Sandusky in the 200 yard relay. Had they won the latter event they would have set a new meet scoring record.

The individual swimmers received medals for their efforts while the team was presented with a handsome trophy in addition to qualifying the entries for the state meet. Again it appears that the Little Giants will be heavy favorites to retain their state crown.

There will be preliminaries in the 50-yard free style and diving events in Columbus Friday night with the other races being decided on time on Saturday.
