## Buckeye Conference Spring Sports Program Slated Friday At Lorain

Annual Buckeye Conference Spring Sports program is scheduled to get under way today at Lorain with the tennis teams of the six schools contesting.

Bulk of the Conference Sports Day will be held Friday at Lorain. Track, baseball and golf will be on the menu Friday.

Tennis part of the show is going on today due to a conflict with the sectional tennis tournament scheduled Friday at Sandusky.

Fremont Ross tennis team will compete in today's conference activity and also in the sectional at Sandusky.

### Track Prelims

Track preliminaries involving the six conference schools, host

Lorain, Elyria, Marion Harding, Fremont Ross, Sandusky and Findlay, will start at 2 p.m. Fremont time Friday on the Lorain Stadium track. Prelims will be in the 100 and 220-dashes and the 180-low and 120-high hurdles.

Finals in the field events will begin at 4:30 Fremont time and the running events at 6 p.m. Fremont time.

Golf teams of the conference will begin 18-holes of competition at Oak Hills golf course, Lorain, at 9 a.m. Fremont time Friday.

Baseball finals for the conference crown will begin at 3 p.m. Fremont time Friday.

Ross high's best bet in the track meet is Bob Atkins, senior speedster, who has run the 100 this season in 10.1 seconds, the 220 in 22.7 seconds and the 440 in 53 seconds.

Ross golf team, led by Orville Sentman, should figure highly in conference competition. Ross golfers own a 5-2 record in dual meets this year. Sentman was medalist in the golf part of the Conference Sports Day at Fremont last spring.

The Little Giants probably won't be involved in the baseball phase of conference play due to participation in district baseball.

There will be no re-scheduling of conference events if there is any postponement due to weather Friday.

## Five Individual Champs Defend Buckeye Track Titles Friday

Five individual champions including Bob Atkins of Fremont Ross will defend titles in the track part of the annual Buckeye Conference Sports Day Friday at Lorain's George Daniel stadium.

Last year at Fremont's Harmon Field, Atkins won the 220-yard dash in 23.2 seconds and also finished third in the 100-dash.

Atkins has run the 220 in 22.7 seconds twice this season to tie the Harmon Field record. He also has run the 100-dash in 10.1 and the 440 in 52.9.

### Ace Distance Runner

A two-event winner last year, Bill Huckaba of Marion Harding, will try to repeat his double win in the 880 and mile runs this week. Huckaba set a new Buckeye Conference and Harmon Field record in the 880 last year in 2:03.1. He has run the distance in 1:59.4 this year. Huckaba's winning time in the mile last year was 4:41.7. He did 4:27 recently.

Mel Taylor of Elyria will be back to defend his broad jump at Fremont in 1959. He went 20 feet to place first.

Judge Scruggs of Sandusky tied for first in the pole vault last year to set a new Buckeye Conference vault mark of 11 feet, 8 1/4 inches with Nash of Findlay. Scruggs has soared 11 feet, 10 inches this year.

Atkins will receive tough competition in the 440 at Lorain from freshman Paul Garrett of Sandusky who has gone 51.6 this year and Dave Bush of Elyria, best time 53.1.

Ben Espy of Sandusky has high jumped 6 feet, 2 1/2 inches and teammate Scruggs 5 feet, 11 inches.

### Vault of Plus 12

Jack Woddell of Marion will give Scruggs a "run for the money" in the pole vault. Woddell vaulted 12 feet, 1 inch in the recent Marion relays to 11 feet, 10 inches for second place Scruggs.

Elijah Tatum of Sandusky, another freshman, has a time of 15.8 seconds in the 120-yard high hurdles, Al Wilson of Lorain 15.5 and Sam Davis of Elyria 16.1.

Marion has tough competitors in Pete Wolfinger in the discus, Ron Scott in the shot put, Pete Poriets in both the high and low hurdles, Tom Cook in the broad jump, Woddell and Dennis Shelton in the pole vault and Ned Porter in the discus. Marion is also strong in the mile and 880-relays.

Findlay's best bets are Paul Oren in the broad jump, Chuck Collins in the discus and Jack

Adams in the 880.

Besides Taylor, Elyria has threats in Harrison Hildreth in the 100, Al Sabo in the 220 and both relay teams are strong.

Lorain has Wilson in the hurdles, Bob Woods in the broad jump, Frank Filisko in the discus and strong relay foursomes.

Ross has a chance for points in the 880-relay with Jim Ohms, Ray Ronski, Lary Wilkins and possibly Tom Geer. Sophomore Tom Koebel might place in the 880 or mile and Dale Hasselbach in the hurdles. Gene Nitschke has a chance in the discus and Dick Hopkins in the pole vault. Atkins also could score in the broad jump.

### Buckeye Records

Along with the pole vault and 880-records set last year at Fremont, other new Buckeye Conference marks set here include a new shot put record of 53 feet, 1 1/8 inches by Bob Middleton of Marion.

Middleton also set a new conference and Harmon Field record in the discus with a toss of 170 feet, 4 inches.

Ernie Delaney of Sandusky tied the 120-high hurdles conference mark of 15.3 seconds. It is also held by Deshuk of Lorain.

Marion's mile-relay team of Poriets, Cook, Fitch and Chamberlain set a new conference record in 3:33.
